**Helping Homeowners Who Need It Most**

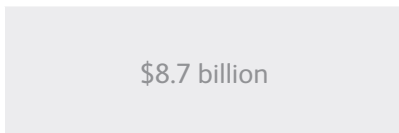
At Chase we are working hard to help families meet their mortgage obligations and keep them in their homes by making their home payments more affordable. We have offered more than 1 million mortgage modifications to struggling homeowners since the beginning of 2009.

We were the first major servicer to open face-to-face counseling centers in the hardest-hit areas of the country; counselors at the 51 centers, including centers in Dallas and Houston, have met with more than 120,000 struggling homeowners since early 2009. We plan to add another 30 Chase Homeownership Centers this year, including centers in Austin, Houston, San Antonio, Arlington, and near Ft. Hood.
